

## Unit 6.6: Materials List

Consider this a “Teacher’s Shopping List”. This list contains the physical materials that must be acquired to complete the unit’s lesson activities.

The materials are separated by consumables and non-consumables. Quantities per class listed are the maximum quantities you will need for one class assuming a class of 30 students. Some lesson plans call for items which are very likely to be available “at hand” either from the classroom, the school, or from home. Usually, these items don’t have to exactly match the list, but can be any of a group of items which suit the need. Such items are not listed here, but are identified in the lesson plans.

**A note on printed materials:** Handouts, student guides, other paper materials and electronic resources are not listed here. Please refer to individual lesson plans for the most up-to-date links for these items to determine an actual page count of printed materials needed for a particular lesson.

<p><b>*Teacher Note:</b> In the Anchoring Experience Phase of Lesson 5, there are 3 suggested activities (“All Tied Up”, “Feed Me”, and “Minefield”). The supplies are listed for all 3 activities but it is intended that students will do only one activity. You need supplies for the activity you choose and can ignore the other activities supplies.</p>
